You have failed 20-40 credits (with no further reassessment opportunities available in your failed modules)*	You can progress onto your next level of studies, but you must take 20-40 credits at the level of your failed modules (usually the same modules that you have failed) alongside your next level of study with attendance.
You have not successfully passed 60 credits	If you have not successfully passed 60 credits and all of these are referred or deferred, you will need to go on a <u>Progression Break</u> to submit your reassessments (if you are in Level 6, you will go on an <u>Assessment-only</u> year to submit your reassessments). If you have failed credits (with no further reassessment opportunities available in your failed modules), you will need to go part-time to retake the failed credits with attendance before progressing to your next level of study. You may also have reassessments in other modules to submit during your part-time year.
You have failed 80 or more credits at one level	You will be excluded from your course.
Foundation Year	Please note that you need to pass 120 credits at Foundation level before you can progress to Level 4.
