The University has the legal duty to monitor your engagement with your course and confirm this with Student Finance, the Office for Students and UK Visa and Immigration for International Sponsored students.

### Your Responsibilities to attend and engage with your course

- Your attendance is essential. This includes at lectures, seminars, tutorials, workshops, labs, placements, site visits and for PGR students scheduled meetings with supervisors.
- You are expected to arrive on time, ready for the start of every session and remain for the duration.
- Check in your attendance on the My Bath Spa app for every session.
- Access your course on Ultra Minerva and submit all your assessments on time, make use of recorded lectures on Panopto as guided by your lecturer and online library resources via Talis.
- You must notify your lecturer in advance if you expect to be absent and check in your absence on the My Bath Spa app. Failure to do so may result in contact from the University.
